### 4. Church Finances

### a) Treasurer's Report

In Dawn's absence, Dick gave the following report:

On the income side:

- Donations are made up of mainly collections from Funerals and Baptisms although there was one donation made of £102 but I do not know who gave this.
- The Fabric and Finance Committee have decided that the money we receive from the sales of plants and bulbs should be included within fundraising and this amounted to £125. Also included within fundraising is £40 from the sale of the Holy socks, £327.97 from Burns Night and £14.62 from the sale of diaries.
- Extraordinary expenditure is the payment for the video licence but this is reimbursed by the film club.
- QQ fundraising is made up of £22.16 donation and a tower box was returned almost full with £89 inside.

On the expenditure side:

- We are not required to pay our quota in January as we opt to pay over ten months.
- This year we have tried to budget the utilities separately. We hope that this has been budgeted correctly based on what we spent last year, but we will have to see how this works out.

We are still in the process of opening a savings account for some of the money held in the current account and I hope that this will be completed very soon.
