This year, the Scratch Choir is directed by **Brian Moles**, Director of Music at St Mary's Portsea. His visit to Waterlooville Music Festival follows a busy start to the year directing the choirs singing *BBCtv's* Songs of Praise from St Mary's Portsea, (transmitted Easter Sunday).

Brian is a freelance music teacher, performer and composer. He holds a Bachelors and Masters degree from the University of London, where he studied organ and composition.

Brian was appointed Direct of Music of St Mary's Portsea in September 2009, and is also Musical Director of the Spezzati Chamber Choir, London, which he co-founded. As a conductor and amateur, Brian has had extensive experience working with groups of all ages and all sizes, both amateur and professional. He is equally at home standing in front of a 140 strong community choir as he is working with a group of six singers, or enthusing and encouraging young people to sing and perform.

During the last few years he has directed the Choral Society at Royal Holloway, sung with the award winning Vasari Singers and Mosaic, one of Hertfordshire's leading chamber choirs. Brian is also an active composer, writing for various different genres, including solo songs, chamber music, music for orchestra, as well as writing for the choral music genre. He has won several competitions, and is regularly being commissioned to write new works. Recently he has had works performed in London, and in various Cathedrals and minsters, including St Albans, Canterbury, Truro and Beverley. Drop, Drop Slow Tears, a work for unaccompanied mixed choir, has recently been published by Boosey and Hawkes in their publication, Calmo.



David Coram's career started as Assistant Organist at Romsey Abbey. In 2007 he released the CD *The Organ of Romsey Abbey* to much critical acclaim. In 2008 he moved on to St Peter's Bournemouth as Director of Music. Rebuilding a nearly-collapsing traditional choir of boys and men from the ground up (there was just one chorister on his arrival) was an immensely draining task, but he had increased membership to 13 junior choristers just twelve months later, also starting a girls choir and re-invigorating a semi-dormant adult voluntary choir to cover holidays.

His 2010-2011 season included concerts in the USA, France, Spain and Germany; the premiere in Salisbury Cathedral of a new motet by Bob Chilcott; the release of his Peter and the Wolf arrangement, recorded in Romsey Abbey with celebrity narrator Richard Briers, along with *Carnival of the Animals* (organ/piano) and Poulenc's *Babar the Little Elephant* (piano) with David Owen Norris at the other keyboard; composer Anthony Scott's centenary; and much else besides!

The Orchestra consists of guitarists from Hampshire, Surrey & Sussex - mostly amateurs - enjoying something really unusual. The Orchestra plays 4 different sizes of Guitar, like the different sizes in a recorder consort, brass band or string quartet. It is one of handful of guitar orchestras - free from the limitations of pitch that constrain guitar ensembles.

The Choir was formed in 1961 in Portsmouth by a group of postmen based at the Head Post Office who found that they enjoyed singing whilst sorting the mail. The original name of the Choir was the Portsmouth Post Office Choir. It later became the Portsmouth and District Male Voice Choir which, in 1974, was changed to the Solent Male Voice Choir. The new name reflected the extended area of membership and concerts. There are, at present, thirty-two choristers in the Choir.



The Solent region extends from Havant and Hayling Island to Portsmouth, Gosport, Fareham and Southampton. To the north it extends to Petersfield and Romsey. Members of the Choir come from around the whole area, even including the Isle of Wight.

SPINNAKER CHORUS

Spinnaker Chorus is a modern, vibrant and friendly group of women with

music in their hearts. It sings a-cappella style music in four-part harmony, called Barbershop. Its repertoire is varied, some old classics, some modern with a twist! In an effort to stay committed to singing and performing at the highest possible level, Spinnaker Chorus competes each year in a national contest. Placed 3rd in 2011 in the 'Quartet of Nations' competition at Birmingham Symphony Hall, previous achievements in the competition have ranged from 1st place (twice), 2nd place (twice), and 3rd place (twice). Also winners of the Solicitors Cup at the Portsmouth Music Festival in 2005.

The Highbury Area Band is a symphonic youth wind band with an extensive repertoire covering the whole musical range including classical, popular, marches, film themes and music from well known shows.

The Band has grown from a small ensemble of wind players who attended Highbury Junior School in Portsmouth to their current status as one of the most accomplished symphonic youth wind bands in Hampshire with members drawn from a number of schools and colleges in South East Hampshire.

During the evening, Highbury Area Band will perform the European and UK Premiere of the wind band version of *Song of the Sea* by composer Alfred Wong. The world premiere of the piece was performed on 21 April 2012 by The Hong Kong Festival Wind Orchestra conducted by Fanny Ma at City Hall Concert Hall, Hong Kong.

RICHARD HORN, Musical Director

Richard Horn started his involvement with the Highbury Area Band in 1997 playing the Euphonium, after spending seven years in the Portchester and Fareham Area Youth Brass Band and two years in a local orchestra playing French Horn. In 2002 Richard was asked to become band leader for HAB, a position which he held for four years. In 2001 he was invited to form the Big Band section of HAB and whilst running this Richard's conducting impressed the musical director Steve Tanner and after a few years he was invited to take rehearsals when Steve was unavailable.

Richard's first concert "in charge" of the band was at the Waterlooville Music Festival 2007.

In 2010 Steve Tanner stood down as Musical Director after 21 years of service, and Richard was appointed Musical Director of the Highbury Area Band in September 2010.

He has many TV and film performances to his credit and has worked with various ensembles including, The Squadronaires, the Nick Ross Orchestra, The Glenn Miller Orchestra and he has toured with the Bob Wilber Band. While taking part in a Jazz Festival, a tribute to Clark Terry, Spence performed with Oscar Peterson and in the Jimmy Heath Big Band.

Spence has also performed various orchestral engagements, which have included working with Malcolm Williamson, Janet Baker and Julian Lloyd Weber.

Opera Comique was formed in Portsmouth as a charitable trust and has raised many thousands of pounds for numerous local and national causes since it was formed in 1976. Opera Comique's personnel are all experienced Gilbert and Sullivan enthusiasts drawn from a wide area of the South of England and perform together several times each year.

Opera Comique has given concerts in the Portsmouth Guildhall and also in many venues in Hampshire, Sussex and Dorset including Portchester and Southsea Castles and in the Guildhall, London and at Basing House. HMS Pinafore and the Pirates of Penzance have been performed on board HMS Victory, HMS Warrior 1860 and TS Foudroyant. Overseas tours have taken Opera Comique to Duisburg in Germany, Rauma in Finland, several locations including Portsmouth New Hampshire in New England USA and Venice - where the Gondoliers has been performed.

Opera Comique has twice arranged events to sing through all the Gilbert and Sullivan operettas in a day (including one in this church) involving many different societies coming to perform an operetta. Sullivan's rarely performed grand opera Ivanhoe has also been performed as a concert version.
